- All new and returning members must re-enroll each year. Registration Fees vary from \$15-40 depending on project selections.
- Although entitled "*Queen Creek 4-H*," the only resident requirement is that you live in Maricopa County.
- 4-H Project Areas usually available include: teen & leadership, dog, horse, lamb, arts and crafts/scrapbooking, small stock (rabbits, cavies, poultry, etc.), goat, swine, sheep, shooting sports, and Clover Kids. New projects may be added depending on youth and adult leader interest!

The 4-H Emblem is a green four leaf clover with a white "H" on each leaf. The emblem symbolizes the desired skills and abilities youth will learn through their participation in 4-H activities.
